

1. How much are College fees?

College fees are broken into 2 categories, Student Contribution Fee and Tuition Fees. Most students will qualify for Free Tuition Fees under the "Free Fees Initiative" and Student Contribution is currently set by the Government at €3,000 per annum. Some programmes also attract a material fee.

2. Can I get a grant to attend College?

Student grants are administered through SUSI. The award of this grant is means tested and application opens circa mid-April every year. You do not require an offer of a place in college to apply and the sooner you apply the sooner you will have a decision and can plan accordingly.

Students who are approved for the Student Grant may have some or all of the Student Contribution Fee paid on their behalf by (SUSI) and you may also be entitled to maintenance support.

3. I have been in College before, do I need to pay extra fees?

Depending on the level and duration of the course, you may be liable to pay tuition fees. Each case is reviewed individually.

4. When do I need to pay my fees?

Fees (normally €3,000) are payable in full before 31 October or in 2 instalments Instalment 1 (€1500) before 31 October Instalment 2 (€1500) before 15 January

5. What do I pay if I withdraw from College?

The fee liability for each student depends on when you withdraw from a course. If you withdraw before the 31st of October, you will be entitled to a 100% refund of any fees paid.

If you withdraw from a course between the 1st of November and the 31st of January, you are liable for Semester 1 fees.

Students who withdraw from a course after the 31st of January are liable for fees for the full year.
